34th Annual Z99 Radiothon Raises \$416,938 for babies needing Regina's NICU

Regina, Sask. – Z99 hosts CC and Lorie hit the airwaves once again, sharing stories of heartbreak and triumph, to help save babies' lives. Thanks to unwavering support from so many generous people in southern Saskatchewan, the 34th annual Z99 Radiothon raised \$416,938 for Hospitals of Regina Foundation in support of the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU), located in the Rawlco Centre for Mother Baby Care at Regina General Hospital. This was the last time the popular radio duo hosted this crucial event, since they are retiring this spring.

"Year after year, the Radiothon is a remarkable success because of the unwavering commitment from the community of southern Saskatchewan and our on-air team of CC and Lorie," says Tom Newton, vice-president and general manager, Rawlco Radio. Over the past 34 years, the Z99 Radiothon has raised over \$10 million for the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU). With outstanding community support, the Radiothon, through Hospitals of Regina Foundation, has provided our NICU with leading edge, life-saving technology that has enhanced the ability of our medical teams to care for fragile newborns.

The NICU is located in the Rawlco Centre for Mother Baby Care at the Regina General Hospital. Each year, 500 babies from 24 to 42 weeks old require care in the unit. The NICU, which also includes the special care nursery for babies who require less intensive care, has capacity for 29 babies. On average, 21 babies per day require care in the unit.
